Mt. Healthy Schools and community gathering items for Sharing Tree

On December 14, dozens of cars will arrive to receive bags of food and toys. Volunteers emerge from the Mt. Healthy Community Center with carts full of shopping bags of chicken or ham, potatoes, canned goods, toiletries, and toys. These items are loaded into the cars with a wish for a happy holiday. The volunteers from the schools' Sunshine Fund and the city's Sharing Tree then return to the building to assemble another load for the next car arriving.

The Sharing Tree/Sunshine Fund is a charitable partnership that serves needy families in the Mt. Healthy City School District. This organization is composed of the Sharing Tree organization of the City of Mt. Healthy, and the Sunshine Fund of the Mt. Healthy City School District. Together, these organizations provided food, clothing, toys, and toiletries to 87 families with over 300 children last year at holiday time.

The families receiving these items have children in the Mt. Healthy City School District. Contributions for the Sharing Tree/Sunshine Fund are received each year from many school children, school organizations, the Mt. Healthy Alliance of Churches, employees of the City of Mt. Healthy and the Mt. Healthy City School District, local businesses, and generous individuals.

All school buildings in the District participate in the donation process. Individual classrooms and individuals adopt a family or a child from a list of those in need and stockpile the goods for distribution in December. For those interested in adopting a child, family or making a donation of food, toys or cash, contact John Peters at 513-470-4920. The goal for donations is December 4, although donations are always welcome.

Proper Waste Disposal

In an effort to maintain our status as a proud and vibrant community the City of Mt. Healthy has ordinances in place that set requirements for property owners concerning household and commercial waste. Specifically, container requirements and times they can be set out for pick up. These ordinances are:

§ 50.02 CONTAINER REQUIREMENTS; SETTING OUT CONTAINERS.

(A) Containers for the disposal of garbage, refuse and junk resulting from the ordinary operations of private residences and households shall be of galvanized iron or other non-rusting material, with tight fitting lids, water tight, and of such size as to be easily handled by one person or tightly closed plastic trash bags.

(B) Containers for the disposal of commercial waste shall be located on the premises for which use they are intended and shall not expose the owners of the adjacent and abutting land nor the general public to unpleasant odors and sights. All such containers shall be kept tightly closed at all times to prevent access to the contents by vermin and rodents. Containers intended for the disposal of commercial waste shall at no time be allowed to overflow onto the surrounding ground. ('74 Code, § 92.21)

(C) Combustible and noncombustible wastes and garbage shall be set out in proper waste containers no earlier than 3:00 p.m. the day before collection at such places, on the premises or on the sidewalks adjacent thereto, as specified in the building code for storage of waste and garbage. Waste containers placed on the premises or on the sidewalks adjacent thereto shall be promptly removed to their usual storage place after the same has been emptied. Waste containers cannot remain on the sidewalks for more than 24 hours after pickup of the garbage. ('74 Code, §92.22)

Also...

Rumpke will not pick up T.V.'s left at curb. Rumpke will only pick up mattresses and furniture if wrapped in plastic and you have to call them at 742-2900 a couple days ahead of when you will have it at curb to let them know.


