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ORDINANCE NO. 19-1877

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 76.13 OF THE MT. HEALTHY OHIO CODE OF ORDINANCES

WHEREAS, the Street Committee has identified out of date sections of the Mt. Healthy Code of Ordinance regarding parking in city-owned lots.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MT. HEALTHY, STATE OF OHIO:

Section 1. That Section 76.13 subsections (A) and (B) of the Code of Ordinances of Mt. Healthy, Ohio is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 76.13 TIME LIMIT FOR PARKING IN MUNICIPAL LOTS

- (A) Except as otherwise provided, it shall be unlawful for any person to park any vehicle on any city parking lot for a period of more than seventy-two consecutive hours.
- (B) Any vehicle parked in violation of this section may be removed at the owner's expense and liability.

Section 2. That existing Section 76.13 subsections, (C), (D), (E), (F), (G), (H), and (I) of the Code of Ordinances of Mt. Healthy, Ohio are hereby repealed. These subsections are as follows:

(C) Permits shall be issued only to persons displaying a current operator's or chauffeur's license, and no person shall hold more than one current permit. Permits shall be issued only for passenger vehicles and trucks that are ¾-ton or less in size. Permits shall not be issued for tractors, boats, trailers, motor homes, or any other types of vehicles. Permits shall be issued only for vehicles which are in roadworthy condition and for which the applicant displays a current vehicle registration card. Permits shall be valid only during such time as the vehicle is

roadworthy and is currently registered. Permits may not be transferred to another person or between vehicles, except that a permit holder may obtain a permit for another vehicle, if otherwise qualified, without payment of an additional fee, on surrendering his current permit.

(D) Permits shall be issued beginning January 1, 1979. Permits shall be issued either for the six-month period beginning January 1 and ending June 30, or for the six-month period beginning July 1, and ending December 31. Permit fees shall be as follows: \$25 if the expiration date is three or more months from the date of issue; \$12 if the expiration date is less than three months from the date of issue.

(E) Permits shall contain the name and address of the permit holder, the year, make, and type of the vehicle, and the license number, and shall be accompanied by a decal which shall be affixed to the lower right corner of the vehicle's rear window. Decals shall be of a different color each permit period. The Clerk shall retain a copy of each permit issued, in numerical order by license number. A reminder notice shall be mailed by the Clerk to each current permit holder 30 days prior to the expiration date.

(F) The City Manager is authorized and directed to designate one-third of the parking spaces in each city parking lot for permit parking only, and he shall clearly identify them as such.


(G) The total number of permits authorized shall be as set by the City Manager.

(H) The Chief of Police shall make the final determination whether an individual or vehicle qualifies for a permit under these regulations.


(I) The penalty for violation of this section shall be, for each offense, \$5 or revocation of the parking permit; however, such revocation shall only be by the Mayor's Court. Failure to pay a parking fine within the time provided shall work an automatic revocation of any long-term parking permit. Any vehicle parked in violation of this section may be removed at the owner's expense and liability. Any person who receives a ticket for parking in an area designated for permit parking only, or for parking overtime, except on Hamilton Avenue, may, if he obtains a permit within 72 hours of the violation, have the ticket voided.

Section 3. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after the first date provided by law.
